2-2-04 Report of meeting with US Filter and MPCA Collection System Operators Conference in St. Paul by Dickson.

End of the year report for water, wastewater, & pump runtimes. (see attached)

The increase over the last 3 years is due to new customer connections. Most connections have been made at this time.

TREASURER

Treasurer report reviewed by Campbell. PUC \$32,278 FWC \$31,186 FSC \$47,026

Campbell recommends no increase in the water and sewer rate, but we will be in the negative in the sewer next year. Regarding a season rate, a high percentage of debt service is included in the service charge; maintain the same rates at this time. Reviewing the forecast. If we don't increase the rates now then we will have to raise the rates more next year.

Tammaro states \$ 17,000 of uncollected charges are in the cash. The maintenance and depreciation have been set aside.

• Motion by Campbell to stay at the existing rates in spite of the increase in water rates from Gilbert, second by Kingston. Discussion-we are looking at the numbers and unsure of the receivables.
