CORRESPONDENCE

<u>Delinquency Reports</u> – Those that had their delinquent utility bill certified to their taxes will fall off this delinquent list, certified several customers.

<u>Water/Wastewater Reports</u> – Busy during the storm in September. Discussion on a new water customer. This customer had a well that was failing and they chose to connect to city water.

OLD BUSINESS

<u>Saint Mary's Lake development</u> – Town Chairman Tony Tammaro shares that Brad Scott will be applying for a new type of grant through IRRRB in the month of November. Town Clerk Heidi Coldagelli to work with Mr. Scott.

Eveleth Water Agreement - No new information

<u>EPA Lead and Copper</u> – Discussion if anyone has reported lead lines. One or two have galvanized, those also need replacement.

<u>Sump pump</u> – Surveys are being returned

<u>Sewer Camera</u> – Quotes received for a sewer line camera and locate equipment. Previous authorization was \$3,000.00. Town Board Chairman Tony Tammaro asks the PUC to table this discussion. Camera quote about \$10,000.00 and Locate quote about \$5,000.00.

 Motion to table the discussion on sewer line camera and locate equipment made by Commissioner Chris Erickson and supported by Eugene O'Brien. Motion carries unanimously.

911 – Discussion on who customers should call in the event of a water or sewer emergency and who would 911 call to assist if 911 was called. Commissioner Amy Jackson joins the meeting 6:16 p.m. Discussion on sharing the sewer call calendar with the Fire Department. Discussion on non-emergent 911 number. Discussion on concerns of customers calling an on-call person for issues that really are not emergent, employees might receive too many calls. The township does have a system called SCADA that calls out personnel for Lift Station issues. The SCADA sewer call out system has worked effectively without any issues.

NEW BUSINESS

Town Board Chairman Tony Tammaro shares that a property on Thunderbird Trail will be going for sale. It is a piece of property that is currently zoned as residential and the owner's brought a request to the planning committee to request this property be zoned as commercial so that it may possibly be sold to the Minnesota Power Company for a storage unit and vehicle dispatch. Property is not sold as of yet.

<u>Treasurer Report</u> – Both sewer and water are positive for year to date and for the month of September. This is good.

Town Board Chairman Tony Tammaro also shares that the Horseshoe Lake Development grant from IRRRB has been extended by one year and one of the property owner's is now currently building. The Township should be able to receive the remaining grant money.
